AAUW Funds

Thank you to all who contributed to our fall fundraisers. Several members made Rada purchases, and that opportunity is on-going. The annual holiday brunch, our traditional fundraiser for LAF, the Legal Advocacy Fund, was well attended, and members made generous contributions. LAF was established in 1981 to support gender discrimination cases. There are currently six active cases, and two cases were settled in 2017.

In 2017, AAUW awarded \$3.7 million in graduate fellowships for women and grants to organizations and branches for a variety of community projects. Our contributions also support AAUW's action projects, including the Start Smart and Work Smart workshops in which more than 17,000 women participated.

A portion of our annual branch contribution went to the Eleanor Roosevelt Fund. This fund was originally multipurposed, but it now generates a semi-annual convention award to an individual or organization in recognition of their work for equity for women and girls.

International Student Panel "Studying in America"

Students from Knox and Monmouth College will share what it is like to be an international woman student studying in America. Students will discuss education in their home country and why they were interested in studying in the US. We'll have refreshments and plenty of opportunity to ask questions.

Alumni Hall is on South Street in Galesburg, the building directly across from Standish Park. There is a circle drive in front, with limited parking, including some handicap parking. There is plenty of parking on Cedar Street along the park and a parking lot on Cedar Street across from the park. You can enter up the grand staircase into the 2nd floor. (Only the center stair case is functional.) There is a first-floor entrance around the corner of the building on the right. Immediately inside that door of the building is an elevator. The Trustees Room is on the 3rd floor. Also on the 3rd floor is the Whitcomb Heritage center, a history exhibit on the Lincoln-Douglas debates and more. It is definitely worth a look.

Seven Feminist Resolutions for 2018

(I have taken the topics listed on the AAUW.org website. For more details, check the website. While you're there, you can also sign up to be a Two-Minute Activist if you haven't already done so.)

- Know your rights at work. Included are legislation about sexual harassment and salary negotiation.
- Vote. Before you cast your ballot, inform yourself about candidates' positions on issues important to you, such as equal pay, family leave, and reproductive rights.
- 3. Negotiate your salary. If this doesn't apply to you, it probably applies to someone in your family. Help bring AAUW salary negotiations workshops to your community.
- 4. Support the next generation of innovators. There is a serious gender imbalance in enrollment in STEM courses and in employment in STEM jobs. Help improve this situation by supporting STEM activities for girls and young women in Monmouth!

- 5. Help young women find their voices. Speak out against workplace sexism. Model this assertive behavior for young women.
- Be an ally. "Social justice is not only for members of marginalized communities." Learn about your own privilege and use it to help others.
- 7. Get involved. One way to do this is to become a Two-Minute Activist, if you haven't already done so. Go to the AAUW website and sign up. It will only take a few minutes. And, go one step further: text AAUW to 21333 to receive alerts directly to your phone when it is time to take action. Another way to Get Involved is to send a check to AAUW to support our mission. Other things to do:

Governor Rauner vetoed the Equal Pay Bill sponsored by AAUW member Anna Moeller. Call the Governor's office (217-782-0244) to express your dissatisfaction with this action. And then call Jil Tracy's office (217-782-8096), Norine Hammond's office (217-782-0416) and Randy Frese's office (also 217-782-8096) to express your concern that neither of them voted to override the Governor's veto! Ask them to support equal pay in the 2018 General Assembly.

The most recent Two-Minute Activist action is to contact our two senators and Congresswoman Cheri Bustos about the DACA Act. All three of them support the Dreamers. They need to hear that we thank them and encourage them to keep up the fight!
