AAUW Turns 137 November 28 Marilyn Van Ausdall

On November 28, 1881, Marion Talbot, then a recent graduate from Boston University, and Ellen Swallow Richards, the first woman graduate of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, invited 15 alumnae from eight colleges to a meeting in Boston. Discouraged by the lack of opportunities available to them, the women discussed how they would join together to help other women attend college and to assist those who had already graduated.

At the November 28 meeting, one graduate from each of the eight represented colleges was chosen for a committee to move toward the next step. So a few weeks later, on January 14, 1882, 65 women college graduates met and officially formed the Association of Collegiate Alumnae, the predecessor to AAUW, to "unite in practical educational work."

AAUW has accomplished much in the last 137 years. Here's to at least 137 more!

HB4163, the Equal Pay Wage History Act was placed on the House calendar for the Fall Veto Session this week. Please call Randy Frese (217-782-8096 or repfrese @adams.net); or Norine Hammond (217-782-0416 or rephammond@macomb.com); whichever is your representative, and Jil Tracy, our senator, (217-782-2479 or senatortracy@adams.net), to urge them to vote to override Governor Rauner's veto. As of last spring, none of our representatives was in favor of the override, but we need to keep letting them know that we are following this bill and expect them to support equal pay. The requirement to reveal past salaries negatively affects women disproportionately when they apply for jobs because of the cumulative effect of wage discrimination.



Legal Advocacy Fund at Work

LAF provides financial assistance for case support (not legal fees) and moral support through the filing of amicus briefs in cases involving gender discrimination. One current case involves four young women who were sexually assaulted while students at Michigan State University. The case addresses the failure of the university to follow Title IX guidelines. Another case addresses the interpretation of the Equal Pay Act of 1963 (EPA). Two female physicians working in the emergency department at a veterans' facility in Little Rock, AR, had their salary frozen while male colleagues in the same department received wage increases.
