

One policy issue for members of AAUW-IL this fall will be to work to override Governor Rauner's veto of HB4163, a wage gap bill passed by both houses of the General Assembly last spring but vetoed by the Governor. The bill, which would prohibit employers from asking potential employees about their wage history, is one step toward closing the wage gap, since women are negatively impacted by revealing their past salaries. The governor, who says he is in favor of closing the wage gap, gutted the bill and suggested that Illinois model its bill after Massachusetts' legislation, which he says is state-of-the art. The bill passed the House by a vote of 87-24; in the Senate the bill garnered a smaller majority of 31 votes.

When the General Assembly meets in veto session in November, I hope to have more news for you.

There you can see how our three representatives in Congress voted on several issues important to AAUW members, including paycheck fairness, access to health care, tax cuts and jobs, the Dream Act, and Title X: Family Planning. Senator Durbin, Senator Duckworth, and Representative Bustos all scored 100%!
